RESEARCH EXPERIENCE

In the 1970s, universities began welcoming social and behavioral scientists into schools OF PUBLIC HEALTH. TWO FACTORS WERE AMONG THE DRIVERS OF THIS MOVEMENT. ONE WAS THE RISING RECOGNITION THAT THE ALLOPATHIC MEDICAL VIEW OF HEALTH AND SICKNESS WAS INSUFFICIENT TO ACCOUNT FOR CAUSES EITHER OF ILLNESS OR GOOD HEALTH. THE SECOND WAS THE EXPANSION OF THE NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH INTO THE ARENA OF CHRONIC DISEASE, ESPECIALLY CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASE AND CANCER, THE MAJOR CAUSES OF MORTALITY AND MORBIDITY IN THE US AND MUCH OF THE WORLD. PIONEER RESEARCHERS HAD BEEN BUILDING THE CASE FOR SEVERAL DECADES THAT MANY UNDERLYING CAUSES OF THESE DISEASES WERE BEHAVIORALLY BASED RISK FACTORS. BY THE 1970S, IT WAS CLEAR THAT SOCIAL AND CULTURAL FORCES ADDED A COMMUNITY/POPULATION DIMENSION. IF INDIVIDUALS COULD BE PERSUADED TO CHANGE THEIR BEHAVIORS AND REDUCE THEIR RISK OF CHRONIC DISEASE, WHAT ABOUT WHOLE COMMUNITIES AND POPULATIONS? THUS, PUBLIC HEALTH IN BOTH THE ACADEMY AND PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE RECOGNIZED THE NEED FOR RESEARCHERS, TEACHERS, AND PRACTITIONERS FROM THE SOCIAL AND BEHAVIORAL DISCIPLINES (INCLUDING COMMUNICATION) TO FACILITATE CHANGE ON A MUCH BROADER SCALE THAN ONE PATIENT AT A TIME. FOR ME, THIS WAS A PROFOUND CAREER DIRECTIONAL CHANGE MADE POSSIBLE ESPECIALLY BY THE MINNESOTA HEART HEALTH PROGRAM (MHHP), A QUASI-EXPERIMENTAL COMMUNITY STUDY TO ADDRESS THE CHALLENGE OF HEART DISEASE AND ITS SOCIALLY AND BEHAVIORALLY FUELED RISK FACTORS. THE WORK OF ACADEMIC PUBLIC HEALTH IF DRIVEN BY THE VALUES OF EQUITY AND THE COMMON GOOD CAN LAY THE FOUNDATION FOR BETTER HEALTH AND WELLBEING.
